AIM OF THE JOPRAD PROJECT

The overall objective of the Euratom JOPRAD project is to study the possibility for setting up Joint Programming of National research programmes in the field of Geological Disposal of Radioactive Waste. The aim is to implement the Joint Programming in a future Euratom work programme. The project is targeting to prepare and propose a work programme and administrative arrangements for Joint Programming.

The Joint Programming includes RD&D on topics related to Geological Disposal, but also other forms of Disposal or Pre-Disposal activities for which there are not yet technically mature solutions available. The forthcoming Joint Programming will also cover strategic and horizontal activities, namely education and training, knowledge management, dissemination, strategic issues.

With respect to the Euratom Waste Directive, (Council Directive 2011/70) these topics refer in particular to Articles 8 (Expertise and skills), 10 and 12.1(j) (Transparency) and 12.1(f) (RD&D).

The main outcome of the project will be a Programme Document comprising programmes focused on key priorities of waste management organisations (WMOs), technical support organisations (TSOs), research entities (REs) and of other public programmes related to the Geological Disposal of Radioactive Waste as well as horizontal and strategic aspects.



OBJECTIVES OF THE REGIONAL MEETING

The meeting goal is to inform on, engage and involve New Member States with "Less Advanced Programmes" (LAPs) in the process of Joint Programming (JP) and its preparation within the JOPRAD project.

In order to achieve the overall objectives, the following particular topics will be addressed:

- Why Joint Programming
- What are the benefits for the Member States
- What could be the domain of activities covered by the Joint Programming
- What is expected from Member State representatives for the implementation of the Joint Programming (Horizon 2020 EURATOM from WP 2018)
- What are the means and tools to implement Joint Programming
- How will Joint Programming be prepared and implemented
- What is expected from the Member State representatives during the JOPRAD project
